## Demographics

- Waller County is on the northwest side of Harris County, which is home to Houston, the fourth largest city in the United States.
- Waller is set to grow ahead of the state and Houston-Galveston area by 2050.
- Waller County is a home to Prairie View A&M University and four (4) independent school districts (Hempstead, Royal, Katy and Waller).
- Proximity to Houston plays an important role in the growth of the county and for the City of Waller.
- The City of Houston is rapidly growing towards Waller County.
- In 2014, there were 44,825 people residing in Waller County, increasing from 32,663 people in 2000 and 43,205 people in 2010.
- Waller grew faster than the Houston- Galveston Area and Texas from 2000 to 2010 and faster than Texas over the entire 2000 to 2014 time period.
